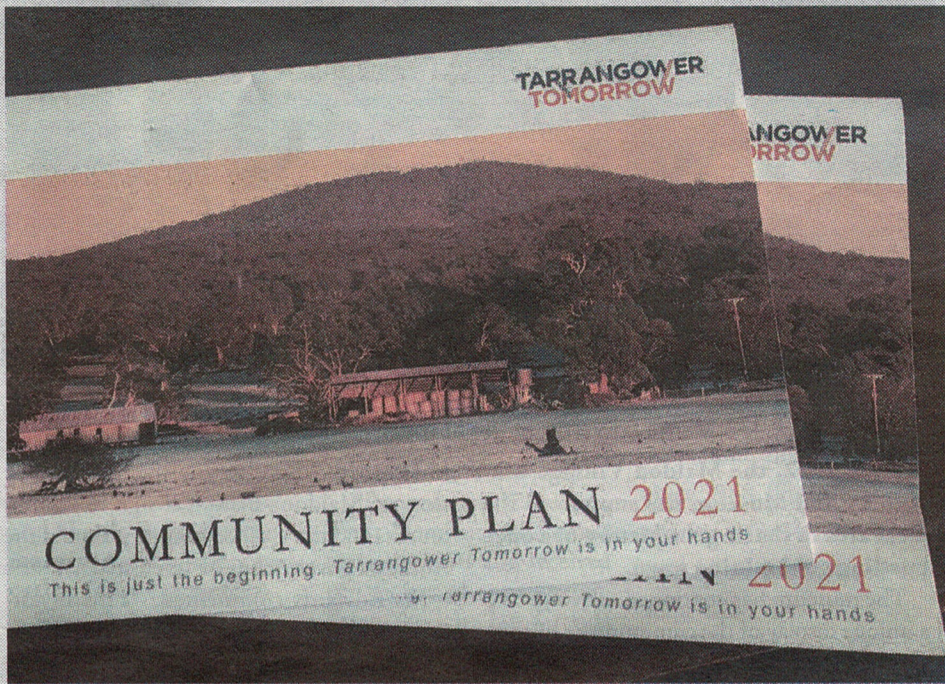


TARRANGOWER TOMORROW

THE Tarrangower Tomorrow Community Plan is looking for community-minded people just like you to help get more projects up and running.

Prior to the pandemic, so many individuals and organisations gave freely of their time to assist in making this Plan a far-reaching and accurate portrayal of what the Tarrangower community (Maldon and surrounds) would like to see come to life for *Tarrangower Tomorrow*. The Plan spells out the future goals as objectives, grouped into five categories. 1. *Our environment and sustainability* 2. *Our local economy* 3. *Our community* 4. *Our heritage, our infrastructure* 5. *Our arts and culture*. Under each category are key projects.

So, no matter how big or small your contribution, either individually or through a support group or committee, *Tarrangower Tomorrow* needs you to help get things done.

What has happened?

There has already been progress in some of the objectives:

- The newly formed group *Friends of Maldon Historic Reserve*, the *Maldon Urban Landcare Group*, and the *Tarrangower Cactus Control Group* have been meeting regularly and working more actively with Parks Victoria. This has led to more effective weed management and improved management of *Maldon Historic Reserve*.
- *Coliban Water* is developing its Urban Water Strategy to improve water security.
- Maldon cyclists and walkers are working on Council's new Active Transport plan, which should improve conditions for walkers, bike riders and other active transport users.
